PASSENGER VEHICLES / PARKING RULES (10/2025)

Either a Pelican Landing sticker, parking pass, or guest parking pass must be easily visible on each vehicle on premises. Please contact the Parking Captains for a parking pass or sticker.

Day visitors including workers and vendors must display the name and the Unit number of the person they are visiting on the dashboard of the vehicle. They may park only in the designated visitor areas with signs.

Owners may request stickers from the parking captains. Limit 2. Tenants are asked to contact the management company at least 14 days prior to arrival for approval of the PLCA Inc Rental/Lease/Occupation Application.

Sunstate provides the parking captains with a list of approved rentals. On arrival, your parking captain should supply the tenant a parking pass. The temporary parking pass will be filled in. The bottom piece will be separated and kept on file. Both pieces will record the dates of the occupancy which will be for no fewer than 30 days nor greater than one year. No new passes will be issued before 14 days from the start date on the pass. Passes must be displayed on the rearview mirror while the vehicle is on premises. A copy of this document will be given to the tenant with the pass.

Guest passes are available for guests (e.g., Family and Friends) who are staying with owners or tenants overnight. The owner or tenant must provide the name and dates of stay. They must park in the Visitor's parking spaces.

No motor vehicles other than private passenger-type vehicles may be parked on the common elements. Personally used pick-ups and SUVs are allowed. Commercially used pick-ups and SUVs are not allowed.

Parking is unassigned and owners may park two licensed vehicles under the building between the months of May and November. From December through April, owners may park two vehicles in tandem under buildings, using one parking place.

Visitor vehicles may be parked only in designated visitor areas and must have a parking pass visible within the vehicle.

No vehicle repair work is allowed on condominium property.

No long-term parking or storage of Owners vehicle or any vehicle, while Owner is not occupying their Unit is permitted. If an owner rents their unit, they may not leave a car parked on site, during the timeframe they rent as the Owner's. parking privilege has been afforded to the renter of their Unit.
